

e1 PROGRAM GRADES 7-8

The e1 program fosters teamwork, independence, collaboration, accountability, curiosity, leadership and time management. Students work individually, in small groups and under the guidance of faculty. The curriculum incorporates opportunities for all academic disciplines and skills. Community resources are explored and choices are made based on the requirements of the Ontario curriculum.

The e1 program covers the Ontario Curriculum in a personal and meaningful manner that connects with the student's experience of their own time and culture.

e2 PROGRAM GRADES 9-10

The e2 program immerses students in the real-world application of what they are learning. Lessons are dynamic and incorporate student choice under the guidance of teachers who hold students accountable for their individual achievements.

Authentic experiences, being on location, participating in real work and interacting with passionate experts are powerful motivators for learning at this age.

The Element High School offers Ontario Secondary School credits leading to the Ontario Secondary School Diploma. 100

e3 PROGRAM GRADES 11-12

Our e3 program provides students with an academically rigorous curriculum that prepares them for post-secondary pursuits. Electives include STEM and Humanities courses as well as Indigenous studies. Students can choose higherlevel courses and graduate with a larger number of Grade 12 courses, further distinguishing their post-secondary applications.

Authentic experiences such as participating in real work and interacting with experts are powerful motivators. Authenticity is a primary consideration in curriculum development in the e3 program.

The location of our campus at Lansdowne becomes a hub of learning and the city is integrated into the delivery of the curriculum.

Students also participate in the Duke of Edinburgh Award Program and do a biodiversity field expedition to an International destination through Operation Wallacea.

GRADE 9-10: A.W.O.L. (AUTHENTIC WORLD OF LEARNING)

The AWOL program provides students with realworld learning opportunities. Activities include community service work, visits to museums, galleries, and historic sites, fieldwork and visits to post-secondary institutions. AWOL trips extend student learning by exposing them to experts, and real-world, complex problems while also helping them to develop transferable skills.

GRADE 11: DUKE OF EDINBURGH AND OPERATION WALLACEA

Students will participate in the Duke of Edinburgh Award program, an internationally recognized award program that empowers adolescents to discover hidden talents, develop untapped leadership potential and make a difference in their community. Our students also begin planning and fundraising for their Operation Wallacea international trip that will have them working alongside real scientists in the field collecting biodiversity and climate change data. Students will undertake this trip in their grade 12 year.

GRADE 12: PRAXIS PROJECT

The Praxis Project requires students to explore an issue of their choosing and present their findings in the form of an academic research paper. Through consultations with professors from both Carleton and Ottawa Universities students are led through the process of writing an academic research paper. Students choose a faculty advisor to support them with their subject matter. Their final papers are published in The Element's Annual Praxis Journal.

GRADE 12: PERSONAL FINANCIAL LITERACY

Students develop budgeting, interest, credit, saving, and simple investing skills for making effective money management decisions.

GRADE 12: LEAVE YOUR MARK

Senior students are asked to leave their mark in a positive way. The possibilities are open-ended, and the mark should be personalized in some way.

TECHNOLOGY
